

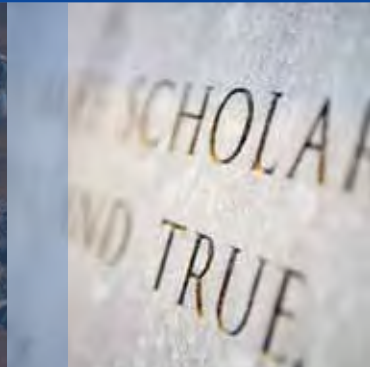

### A Diverse Student Body Enriches Your Degree

The program is designed to accommodate the needs and goals of a diverse student population. The diversity of our students has developed into a community where students not only learn from top faculty, textbooks, readings, and guest lecturers; but also from the experiences of their classmates. Our students come from locations as far-ranging as Asia, the Middle East, Europe, South America, and Africa, in addition to the United States. Similarly, they bring an educational background as diverse as their ethnic background. Although the majority have completed an associate's degree, many have completed the required 60 transfer credits without finishing an actual degree. Some are transferring from four year institutions after deciding to pursue business; others are coming from educational institutions in other countries.

### Program Admission

Admission to the program requires the previous completion of 60 transferable college-level credits from a regionally accredited college or university, in the following areas.

Communication, math, and computer skills: 18 credits required

Liberal arts: 18 credits required

Business preparation (statistics, economics, accounting, business law): 18 credits required

Electives: 6 credits (maximum)

### The Tools and Resources to Advance Your Career

The Carey School's Career Services office provides a wide range of programs and services to help students identify appropriate career options, develop a career strategy, and contact appropriate employers. Educational programs provide advice and training in a variety of career development skills, including:

- Self assessment
- Resume writing
- Networking
- Interview techniques and practice

Students also have opportunities to meet with prospective employers through panel discussions, workshops, and industry presentations. These are great ways to learn about specific careers, industries, and companies to help hone your job search and identify the right next steps.

The office also provides several ways to connect students and employers. Each year hundreds of jobs are posted on our career Web site, student resumes are solicited for dozens more employers, and beginning in 2011, on campus interviews will be offered for selected employers.

### Multiple Options to Finance Your Education

The Carey Business School offers a range of financial aid options, including federally subsidized loans, state aid, and several institutional grants and scholarships. Grants and scholarships are generally based on financial need and are competitive. All financial aid applicants, including those applying for scholarships, must submit a FAFSA and Institutional Financial Aid Application.
